

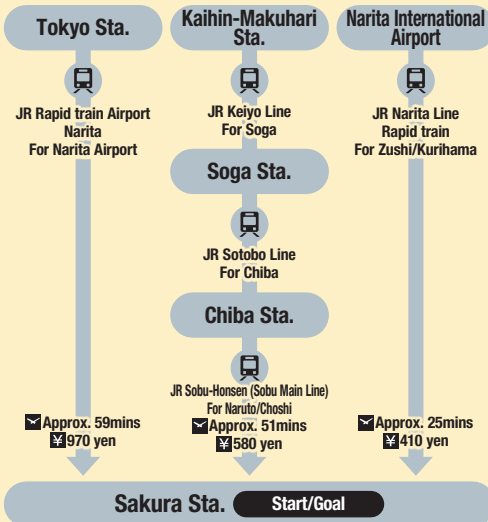
# H4 To Sakura, a place retaining the flavors of an old castle town ROUTE

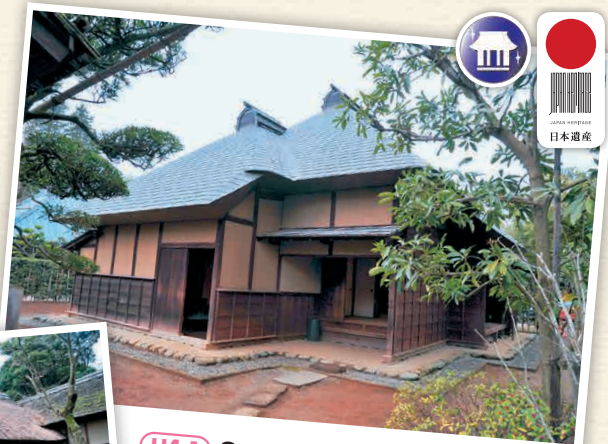

### H4-3 National Museum of Japanese History

Approx. 20mins or take Chiba Green Bus at the bus stop in front of National Museum of Japanese History for Keisei Sakura Station (south entrance), approx. 5mins, 170 yen

The castle town of Sakura, has noteworthy historical spots registered as Japan Heritage, so please make a thorough sweep of the town. The noteworthy spots are dispersed so one plan might be to use a rental bicycle. Bicycles can be borrowed from the Tourist Information Center at the north entrance to JR Sakura Station (9:00-16:00, 500 yen per bike)



### H4-1 Samurai Houses

Three restored blocks of a samurai house from the latter part of the Edo period are open to the public. Learn more about the lives of samurai at the time.

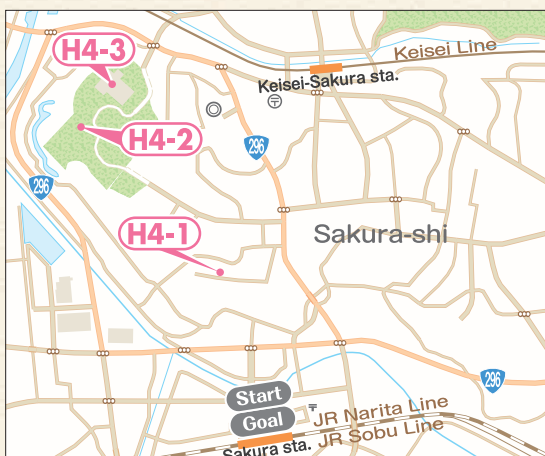
### H4-2 Sakura Castle Park
